Kitchen Reno Complete

Under the management of Dana Brown, the renovations of the kitchen in the church hall have been completed.

The passthrough was relocated to the south side of the building, and existing large appliances were moved to optimize kitchen workflow and eliminate congestion.

The existing flattop griddle can serve dual use as a griddle and an extra cooktop.

The ACW also purchased a new energy efficient refrigerator.

Flooring, cabinetry facing, and countertops have been updated to a modern look and feel.

Sinks, cabinetry, and plumbing fixtures were reused where possible.

The office space in the church hall has been repurposed as dedicated storage space for pantry items, large cookware items, tableware and linens, and other items consolidated from the three former parishes.

By repurposing the existing office space for kitchen overflow, we avoid the negative environmental impacts of new construction and the associated demolition and landfill waste. Additional environmental benefits include reusing existing appliances and building materials where possible, conserving resources and building materials.

The kitchen renovations have been largely financed by our grant application to the Our Faith Our Hope fund, where we applied for \$23600. Bishop Fenty gave his support of our grant request, which was subsequently reviewed by Peter Misiaszek, Director of Stewardship Development, and then sent to the Allocations Committee for final approval.

The remainder of the kitchen renovation budget was financed through specially designated donations from parishioners as well as Holy Trinity Clearview's investments.

The renovations complement our vision of engaging fully with the present, in order to move boldly, with faith, in the future.

Singhampton Building Update

The Singhampton building has been sold, as of March 15, 2019.

David Badian, who is the Director of the Property Resources, handled the sale, as the Singhampton property has always been owned by the Diocese of Toronto.

The Diocesan Council has allocated 50% of

the net proceeds to the Ministry Allocation Fund, and 50% of the net proceeds allocated to Holy Trinity Clearview.

No further details have been revealed by David Badian or his office, including the closing price or any details of the buyer.

The sale was brokered by Re/Max Four Season Realty in Collingwood.

Grant Application Being Submitted

The Our Faith Our Hope grants are no longer accepting applications. Instead, the remaining funds are being planned to be divided among the four episcopal areas.

Therefore, we plan to submit an application directly to Bishop Fenty requesting \$37400 for our communications strategy project.

The project will include installing a backlit colour LED sign, to clarify our physical location, and to promote our presence.

The project will also include installing A/V equipment, which would enable the streaming of live video and audio from the church to the church hall, and also allow the recording of sermons.

Finally, the project will include upgrades to our website, which would enable us to post recorded sermons online.

This would accommodate those unable to attend liturgy in person, as well as an additional means of engaging our community in ministry.
